The Periphery photography exhibit and film features a number of individuals in the Jewish community of Toronto including a member of the Bene Israel of India community, a gay Iraqi Jew, an individual with Ethiopian and Canadian parents, one with a Japanese mother and Jewish Canadian father, two with Black and White Jewish parents, and one who is gay with Brazilian and Black parents. All struggle with their identities and their reception in the larger community and within the Jewish community as outsiders who are not fully accepted and welcomed.
