New Laws

At the turn of the last century, North Dakota enacts laws prohibiting marriage of alcoholics, insane or individuals with tuberculosis.

1899, Michigan passed similar legislation with fines up to \$1,000 or prisons terms up to 5 years.

Forced Sterilization



In 1907, Indiana passed the first sterilization law of the mentally ill and criminally insane.

By 1930, at least 15,000 sterilized.


By late 1920s, 28 states had sterilization laws.



By 1939, more than 30,000 people sterilized in 29 States on eugenic grounds. Almost half of these sterilized in California. Some argue that as many as 68,000 were sterilized.



Karl Pearson: The Problem of Alien Immigration into Great Britain


It is illustrated by an Examination of Russian and Polish Jewish Children. He argues against the admission of Jewish immigrants (identified as a "parasitic race" into England on the basis of his data.

What about Euthanasia?

 Discussion of the euthanasia question peaked in both the U.S. and Britain between 1936 and 1941. Alexis Carel (inventor of the iron lung - criminal and insane "humanely and economically disposed of in small euthanasia institutions supplied with proper gases."



In 1942, Dr. Foster Kennedy, professor of neurology at Cornell in an article published in the American Journal of Psychiatry called for the killing of retarded children 5 and older - "those hopeless ones who should never have been born - Nature's mistakes."




Psychology:

James McKeen Cattell: Highlighted the importance of genetics, quantitative methods, and the study of individual differences.


G. Stanley Hall: "An ounce of heredity is worth a hundredweight of civilization or schooling."

Anthropology (Alfred Cort Haddon: "Ethnology: Its Scope and Problems" - Native races; Wise administration of native states



Anthropology (George Amos Dorsey): "The Problems of Somatology" - exterminating certain of the lower races

"Is it a problem, or is it simply a fact, which we cannot change if we would, that the highest representatives of our boasted civilization today are actually not reproducing their own numbers; that the progress of the white race is making for its own overthrow and final extermination."

William John McGee, President of the American Anthropological Association, Head of the Anthropology Department of the Fair and dubbed by a Saint Louis newspaper as "The Overlord of the Savage World."






A psychology lab at Washington University was set up for anthropometric testing. Head size, reaction time, sensory/perceptual processes were measured in approximately two-thirds of the Indigenous "visitors." Identified as "primitive" peoples, these intelligence and other measures were designed to highlight European progress in evolution.

"Anthropology Days" or "Special Olympics"

In an endeavor to highlight White European genetic superiority, the "anthropology days" games were held prior to the 1904 summer Olympics held in Saint Louis.






"Anthropology Days" or "Special Olympics"



The Fort Shaw Boarding School's basketball team was not allowed to participate in the games due to their gender. However, presented as a model boarding school at the fair.

1904: G. Stanley Hall, founding President of APA

- •Described First Peoples as childlike, with adults from this group being more similar to White children or adolescents in their development.
- •Supported the development of "civilizing programs" tailored to what he deemed to be the needs of First Peoples
- •These programs, once enacted, attempted to eradicate First Peoples' culture, language, and spiritual life.
- •Advocated for forced sterilization, immigration quotas, and Indian Boarding Schools.



Nazi Perspective on US Eugenics

In 1917, the Berlin branch of the Society for Racial Hygiene starting pushing for laws similar to the United States. In particular, they lauded U.S. immigration policies

In 1924, Dr. Gustav Boeters stated, "What we racial hygienists promote is by no means new or unheard of. In a cultured nation of the first order - the United States of America - that which we strive toward (sterilization legislation) was introduced and tested long ago. It is all so clear and simple."

One member of the Eugenics Record Office in the United States, remarked "Hitler should be made an honorary member of the Eugenics Record Office" - in relation to its efforts at removing Semitic elements from the German race.

The Nuremberg Code

- 1. Voluntary informed consent.
- 2. Fruitful result for the good of society.
- Prior experimentation on animals, and prior knowledge of the problem.
- Avoidance of unnecessary physical or mental injury.
- 5. Banning of known lethal or disabling procedures.
- 6. Degree of risks should not exceed benefits.
- Proper preparation and facilities to prevent injury or death.
- 8. Performance of experiments only by scientifically qualified people.
- 9. Participants may freely end the experiment.
- 10. The experiment must stop if it proves too dangerous.





What is Social Justice?

Definition: Justice is fair and equitable treatment entitled to all persons. Social justice is justice applied at the societal level in the equitable and fair distribution of opportunities and privileges within a society.
